1. APPLY FOR ADMISSION

- Submit \$20 non-refundable fee
- Watch the mail for a letter containing your Student Tech ID and PIN number

2. COMPLETE ONLINE ORIENTATION

- This is required of ALL students enrolling for eight or more credits.

3. COMPLETE THE PLACEMENT TEST

4. REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS (IF NEEDED)

FINANCIAL AID BASICS

WHY

Financial aid is intended to fill the gap between the actual price of the school and what students and their families can realistically contribute.

WHAT

There are three types of financial aid available to most students:

- grants and scholarships (financial aid you don't repay)
- loans (financial aid you must repay)
- work study and community or military service (financial aid you earn)

Most students receive a financial aid package put together by the school you plan to attend. It may include all three of these types of aid.

Note: A no-interest payment plan is also available.

WHO

Whether you're old or young, new to college or returning, have family to help or are on your own, to qualify for financial aid at Anoka-Ramsey you only need to be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national (or an eligible non-citizen) and, for a Minnesota college, a resident of Minnesota.

HOW

Financial aid is often based on financial need. But to receive any grants, loans or work study assistance, you need to fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To begin your application, visit www.fafsa.ed.gov. The Anoka-Ramsey Community College school code is: 002332.

WHEN

In Minnesota you can file as soon as you have completed your tax return. Applications are accepted up to 30 days after the semester starts. For example, to apply for financial aid for the fall semester, you can fill out a FAFSA anytime after your taxes have been filed (due April 15) until 30 days after the fall semester begins.

ANOKA-RAMSEY SCHOLARSHIPS

Along with federal and state financial aid, Anoka-Ramsey offers numerous scholarships. In 2010-2011 alone, 120 Cambridge Campus students received more than \$74,400 in scholarships. Approximately 130 Coon Rapids Campus students received more than \$130,000 including four Presidential Star scholarships that pay for full tuition and books!
